

Ranking road safety performance across participating countries since 2006

















PROGRESS AND CHANGE IN KM DRIVEN 2019-2020




ROAD SAFETY PROGRESS 2010-2020



RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLICY DEVELOPMENTS

- For countries who have not done it yet: set targets to halve the number of road deaths and serious injuries 2020-2030
- Fast track KPI data collection and targets
