






78% of cyclists are killed in collisions with (a) motorised vehicle(s) 2011-2013



Recommendations to Member States

- Keep records of the numbers of deaths and serious injuries of cyclists in incidents not involving motor vehicles
- Tackle high levels of underreporting
- Record cycling exposure data
- Develop and use collision maps with cyclists with special focus on turning-accidents
- ✓ Include alcohol as cyclist collision cause
