





PROGRESS AND CHANGE IN KM DRIVEN 2021-2022












EU ROAD MORTALITY 2022 AND 2012

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLICY DEVELOPMENTS

- Adopt and implement the Safe System approach
- Provide sufficient government funds
- Make the choice of measures based on sound evaluation
- For countries who have not done it yet: set targets to halve the number of road deaths and serious injuries 2020-2030

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR EU POLICY DEVELOPMENTS

- Fast track KPI data collection and targets
- Fast implementation of the EU Road Safety Strategy
- Speed limit recommendation for all roads
- Road Safety Agency

WHY POLAND?

- Almost halved the number of road deaths over the period 2012-2022
- A long-term national road safety programme with a target of further reducing deaths by 50% by 2030, with Vision Zero by 2050
- A Safe Road Infrastructure Programme 2021-2024 aiming to improve road safety on national roads by creating safe road infrastructures
- Guidelines for institutions responsible for managing pedestrian safety were published in 2015, 2017 and 2018 and national guidelines for safe cycling infrastructure were published in 2019
- Speed enforcement efforts are constantly increasing and new regulations regarding automatic speed enforcement are being introduced into Polish law
