In 2010, the European Union renewed its commitment to reduce road deaths by 50% by 2020, compared to 2010 levels. By comparing Member State performance, the PIN serves to identify and promote best practice and inspire the kind of political leadership needed to deliver a road transport system that is as safe as possible.
